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HYDERABAD: URDU HAS THE POTENTIAL TO BECOME AN INTERNATIONAL LANGUAGE FOR COMMUNICATION LIKE ENGLISH. IN UNITED ARAB EMIRATES (UAE), WHERE EARLIER COURT PROCEEDINGS WERE USED TO BE DONE IN ARABIC LANGUAGE ONLY, ADVOCATES ARE NOW ALLOWED TO PLEAD THE CASES IN URDU LANGUAGE ALSO.


Dr. Aquil Ahmad, Director, National Council for Promotion of Urdu Language (NCPUL), New Delhi expressed these views today at Maulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU) during the inauguration of the training programme for teachers of Madrassas. He was the Chief Guest.

Centre for Professional Development of Urdu Medium Teachers, MANUU in collaboration with NCPUL is organizing the 7 days programme.

Dr. Aquil Ahmad while congratulating CPDUMT for conducting 62nd training programme said that beside teaching, provision of training is hall mark of Madrasas. Ensure modern education along with the conventional teaching, students need to be taught moral values also, he added.

EXPERIMENTAL TEACHING IS QUIET EFFECTIVE AND TEACHERS SHOULD UNDERSTAND THE NEEDS AND REQUIREMENTS OF THE STUDENTS. PRAISING IS MORE EFFECTIVE THAN PUNISHMENT, SHE ADVISED. TEACHERS SHOULD ALSO INCULCATE VALUES IN THE STUDENTS AND BECOME THEIR ROLE MODEL. TEACHING SHOULD BRING CHANGE IN THE BEHAVIOUR OF LEARNERS, SHE ADDED.

Prof. S. M. Rahmatullah emphasized that art of teaching is not so easy but commitment towards teaching makes a teacher successful. Good teacher is always a student. Islam gives immense importance to education yet the Muslim community is lagging behind in education field, he reminded.

Earlier, Prof. Mohammed Abdul Sami Siddiqui, Director, Centre welcomed the gathering and said that the training programme is a combination of respecting the noble profession and equipping it with modern demands. Prof Siddiqui Mohammed Mahmood, Convenor Programme briefed about the programme and spoke about the

vision to promote Urdu as a medium and English as marketing skill. To promote Urdu language it is necessary to strengthen Urdu schools, he said.

Hyderabad: The United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF) in collaboration with the Maulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU) Dept of MCJ, conducted a two-day workshop, 'The Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC),' on November 15-16.

The UNICEF India, who has been working towards child rights over the past several years, conducted this programme in the campus to make journalism students responsible and sensitive towards the

rights of children. These were the views expressed by Sonia Sarkar, Communication Officer (Media), UNICEF India, on the second day of the Workshop. As part of the Global Rights Act, healthy media could help governments in taking steps towards providing social and educational rights to the children in India, she added further.

The workshop was conducted as part of the 30 years of CRC celebrations and in continuance with UNICEF's capacity building initiatives to instill the child's rights' perspective in reporting among the academic and budding journalists.

Professor Md Fariyad, Dept of MCJ, MANUU, while opening the discussion on the second day, said that UNICEF introduced tenets of the Child Rights Convention, and gave a brief explanation about the 54 articles under CRC with an emphasis on Youth Voices and Child Participation.

Eminent journalist Dr M H Ghazali spoke about 'Children's Participation in Child Rights.' He presented short films highlighting the dropout rates of children in India and later held a discussion with the participants regarding the message that emerged from videos.
